

# More info on ... Residence features

## In our residences we offer:

- professional managers who live in residence
- front desk staff available in various residences during the day and available by phone 24 hours
- study and meeting rooms
- in-room computer connections (RezNet)
- full-time maintenance and caretaking staff
- card-activated washers and dryers
- surrounding green space for outdoor sports and recreation
- easy access to public transportation
- access to fitness facilities
- music practice rooms with piano
- fully-trained staff members on each floor
- active residents' councils/associations

## What does the University provide in my room?

- bed frame and mattress (approximately 196 cm (77") long by 91 cm (36") wide)
- desk and chair
- closet
- dresser
- wastebasket and recycling bin
- corkboard
- bookshelves
- mattress protector

## May I use my own furniture in my room?

Furnishings must be properly assembled and meet safety standards; therefore, the only furniture allowed in student rooms is university-issued. Overstuffed, plastic, or combustible furnishings procured from other sources may be a safety hazard or pose an increased risk of fire.

## Can I "customize" and disassemble my furniture the way I like?

For safety reasons no furniture should be disassembled for any reason, nor is furniture to be reassembled in a manner for which it was not originally designed. Any furniture that is disassembled will need to be reassembled by a recognized professional at the student's cost. Any student who takes apart his/her furniture may face disciplinary sanctions.

## Can I get a small refrigerator for my room?

Refrigerators brought from home must be in excellent working condition and conform to all safety, health, and size regulations. Maximum size: 65 cm (26") deep, 55 cm (22") wide, and 90 cm (35") high. Refrigerators are provided in all suite-style residences.

## What if I want to make a snack?

In Saugeen-Maitland and Delaware Halls, common area kitchenettes are provided for floor social functions and for preparing light snacks. The kitchenettes are not designed for food storage or the preparation of full meals. Except in suite-style residences, preparation of meals is prohibited in residence because of the danger of fire and sanitation issues.
