

More info on . . . Room Assignment

Single room requests

The majority of first-year students are accommodated in double rooms. However, there are a limited number of single rooms available in the traditional-style residences. If you indicate a "yes" response to this question you are signifying to us that if a single room becomes available for you, we should disregard your request for a specific roommate. Your roommate will not necessarily be upgraded to a single room as well, and may be matched with another roommate. If you are upgraded to a single room, you will be assessed the additional single-room fee. Single-room upgrades are based primarily on such factors as age and lottery number.

Presidents' and Faculty Entrance Scholarship recipients are guaranteed a single room. Please indicate a "no" response on your online questionnaire if you wish to decline your single-room guarantee.

Please note that, based on situations of high demand, there are no guarantees that a single room will be offered.

Can I move to another residence or room?

There is a settling-in period until Thanksgiving. After that, building and room switches are occasionally permitted (or required). Such switches occur only under exceptional circumstances and are at the discretion of the Residence Life Management Team. Students who are moved to another residence will be charged/credited any differential in room or meal plan rates.

Moving to a single room

There are a limited number of single rooms for first-year students in the traditional-style residences. Single rooms are assigned based on such factors as special need, age and lottery number. In some cases, students who have requested a single room, but were placed in a double room, may still be upgraded if a suitable vacancy occurs.

Prior to move-in day in September, if you are upgraded from double- to single-room accommodation, you will find out upon your arrival. After move-in day, any upgrading from double- to single-room accommodation will be at the discretion of the residence manager. No upgrading will take place if a loss of revenue may be incurred. Any student who is upgraded from a double to a single room will be responsible for paying the single-room rate, which will be pro-rated from the time the offer of single-room accommodation is accepted.
